

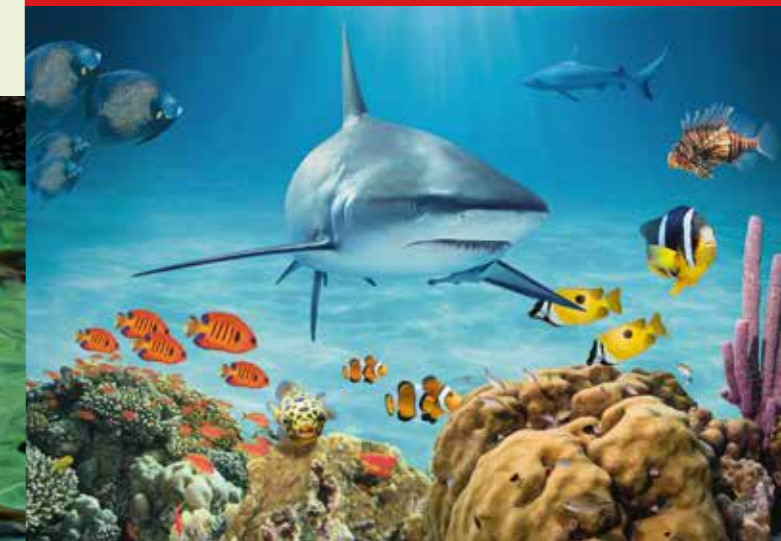

The jungle calls – the Tropical Aquarium

Take a stroll through a jungle landscape and dive into colourful underwater worlds!

In the middle of Hamburg in our Tropical Aquarium, you can discover strange habitats of life on more than 8.000 square meters: more than 600 amphibians, over 200 reptiles from 37 different species and several thousand colourful, exotic fish. A whole group of lively ring-tailed lemurs welcomes you at the entrance to our tropical tour on the Madagascar Village Square.

Your path through the tropics will take you across the continents of Africa, South America and Asia. Take your time for our Tropical Hall. Here, free living basilisks and amphibians cross your path, while flying foxes and a variety of exotic birds fly over your heads. Of course, the dangerous Nile crocodiles and venomous snakes won't come as close to you. Be impressed by the coral pool, which with its 57.000 liters of water, is one of the largest in Germany. Hagenbeck's coral school regularly raises offshoots of these endangered species and sends them to aquariums worldwide.

Highlight of the Tropical Aquarium for most of our visitors is the impressive Great Shark Atoll. Observe through the huge panorama window as sharks and rays make their way through one of the largest seawater facilities in Europe.

Important information:

- Bringing own animal food is not allowed!
- Wheelchair users are also welcome here! All areas in the Tropical Aquarium and the circular path in the Zoological Garden are handicapped accessible.
- Because some of our animals are free roaming, dogs are not allowed in the park.
- Animals in the Tropical Aquarium are partly very sensitive to light. Therefore, photography is only allowed **without flash!**
- Due to the narrow paths, **prams** are not allowed in the Tropical Aquarium. They can be parked in front of the entrance.
- If you wish to leave the Tropical Aquarium for a short time, please let the porters know.
- **Emergency informations:** If you need an ambulance/fire department please inform our guest service! Our staff knows the shortest routes and emergency access. Defibrillators are located at the entrances to the Zoological Garden and the Tropical Aquarium. **Emergency telephone: +49 (40) 53 00 33 -450**

Expedition to strange worlds – the Zoological Garden

Where polar bears and elephants say good night to each other...

Hagenbeck Zoological Garden is as much a part of Hamburg as the harbor, the Michel and the Elbphilharmonie. More than 1.400 animals from around 140 species from all continents have found a home in the extensive enclosures and the magnificent, botanically diverse park complex.

Numerous young animals can be admired the hole year: leopards, antelopes, orang-utans and many more. Hagenbeck is particularly proud of the youngest polar bear offspring. For more than 20 years, the Zoological Garden has waited for an offspring of these endangered predators.

A very special experience is a visit to the unique Arctic Ocean where animals from the North and South Poles meet. Spot penguins and marvel at breathtaking above- and underwater views of polar bears, fur seals and walruses.
